The Department of Modern Languages and Cultural Studies invites applications for an instructor of American Sign Language in the Department of Modern Languages and Cultural Studies to begin in the Fall 2021. This is a temporary position for one section of intermediate level ASL in Fall 2021 term and, pending renewal, one section of intermediate level ASL in Winter 2022 term. The course must be delivered remotely; applicants must be within Canada.

Successful applicants will have:

- A Master's degree in Linguistics, Second Language Teaching, Education or related field, from an accredited Institution.
- Completion of Signing Naturally Instructor Training courses in Level 200 and higher.
- ASLPI Level 4 or higher required.
- Native or near-native fluency in American Sign Language.
- A minimum of 3 years ASL Instruction at the post-secondary level, including teaching experience at the intermediate/advanced level of ASL.
- Superior knowledge of second language teaching pedagogy.
- Demonstrated collegiality and excellence in working with undergraduate students as both an instructor and mentor.
- Experience with technology-based teaching tools; experience teaching in the remote environment preferred.

Primary responsibilities include teaching 2 ASL language courses at the intermediate level. The successful candidate will work closely with existing instructors in the program to offer a well-rounded, coordinated curriculum in American Sign Language.

Salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications in accordance with the Academic Teaching Staff Agreement.
